I’m recommending an auction that misses a cold game?</p> <p>Well, it’s a very marginal decision whether that North hand is a weak no trump or whether it’s too strong. If it’s a weak no trump then South certainly hasn’t enough to bid on. But, even so, if you treat it as a 1♥ opening, South has no more than an invitational raise, so do you get there anyway?</p> <p>Game is obviously pretty reasonable; with the club finesse working it’s almost cold and, should it fail, you still have a chance of bringing in the spades. That's two hands out of two where a weak no trump is a sensible choice despite the five card major.</p> <p>This time East has a clear cut weak no trump. All those intermediates make it worth an opening bid. If your system allows, you could investigate a spade fit as West and then subside in 3♦. Mine doesn't so I have to play in 3♦. That's going to be at least a couple off, which I'm afraid will be a pretty poor score.</p> <p>You may console yourself by saying that North can make 3NT, so long as one avoids the reasonable, but losing, line of two club finesses. South can't make 3NT, of course, on a heart lead. At this point I don't think South has a problem. Although you are 5-5, partner clearly doesn't have a heart fit, your own are solid and you have no intention of playing in diamonds. So where else should you look but 3NT?</p> <p>West has a horrible lead against 3NT. First, after partner single raises your opening bid, surely nothing could be more obvious than 2NT on a balanced 18 count? This 18 count, however, is pretty ghastly, with seven losers and not much in trick taking potential. I would be strongly tempted to pass at pairs.</p> <p>So is 2♠ the right response? I think not, with a good side suit, much better playing potential than your point count suggests, not to mention little in defence. If your system allows, it looks more like a semi pre-emptive 3♠ response to me. The first three bids are completely obvious and now what is South expected to do? You have more than enough for game, a singleton in partner's suit; your own hasn't been supported. What else are you supposed to bid other than 3NT?</p> <p>Yeah, you can make 7♦. That's with a 3-2 break in trumps, a 3-3 break in spades, a club finesse, even a heart finesse if necessary. West should certainly raise hearts and North is pretty much obliged to stick his oar in with 2♠. East is worth game and South is bound to take the save. That looks an automatic 300 against a vulnerable game, clearly a good sacrifice. It would of course be suicidal for East to accept the push to 5♥.</p> <p>As East you know this is going to happen. Is there anything you can do to prevent it?</p> <p>Not a lot, I'm afraid. You might muddy the waters, perhaps with a spurious game try of 3♣, or perhaps a game try double, and then bid game anyway when partner signs off. Whether South starts with 1♣ or an off-centre 1NT (not for me when you have the boss suit), East will overcall, South will support spades and North will bid game. 4♠ is obviously cold, but will East-West sacrifice? With an eight card suit East has a good case, though those honours in the side suits might make you feel uneasy that you are being bounced into the dreaded phantom. Should North-South accept the push to 5♠, a club lead will definitely beat it. To my mind, with seven losers and excellent controls, it's too good for a weak no trump, so I'd start with 1♥. East makes the obvious response and South decides to get busy. West has nothing more to say, East's next action is equally clear, and West is at the crossroads.</p> <p>Actually, you can get really rich by passing. Your side has seven top tricks in defence and can engineer an eighth on a trump promotion if you time it right. That'll teach South to mess us about!</p> <p>But most of the time West will play in 3NT. On a club lead you duck and there's a straightforward squeeze for ten tricks, whether or not you rectify the count by ducking twice. This time I believe South does best not to muddy the waters; if East-West think they're being talked out of something they might react aggressively.</p> <p>As it has gone should East force to slam? I think it's a really tough decision; if you do, West will be really excited. As we see, seven of either red suit is cold, but how many will get there? Not many, I suspect. 6♥ plus one should score well enough.</p> <p>Here's an idea. Over the double of 4♠ how about 4NT from East (two places to play). Whatever West responds, you continue with 5♥. West is too weak for a WJO, even by my standards. North makes the obvious raise and now West can't resist temptation. North's double suggests a decent hand (well, whatever) and South has little choice but to go for blood. Meanwhile, East wonders why it seems to be a sixty point pack!</p> <p>So how will 2♠ doubled get on? Heart lead, diamond return and declarer is feeling unhappy.
